Prayer Chain

Suppose you loan a person \$500. Then the person comes and says, "I can't pay you back." How would you feel? At the very least, you might say, "I'll never loan you any more money." At worst, you would demand payment. Either way, it would have a poor influence on your relationship. Transfer this to the spiritual realm and you have what we as Catholics call indulgences. Almost. The difference is that we receive payment in an indulgence, not that we forgive unpaid debt. The payment comes from the Church, which has received the authority from Jesus to write off the debt. "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven, and whose sins you retain are retained," Jesus told his apostles.

This concept of indulgences is indeed found in the Bible. Remember Moses and the giving of the Ten Commandments? Remember how while Moses was with the Lord God's wrath against the Israelites arose? God intended to destroy them for their sin. But Moses prayed, "Remember your servants Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, and how you swore to them by your own self, saying, 'I will make your descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky..." So the Lord relented in the punishment he had threatened. This is an indulgence won by the faithfulness of Abraham and applied to the sinful Israelites. Likewise Solomon was pardoned because of the faithfulness of his departed father David.

These and other examples point the way to the Church. Here the people are pardoned by God our Father through the Son in the Holy Spirit. We live in a family, a community of God in the Church. That's true in the natural order of life. It is also true in the supernatural realm. The saints bear our burdens, and we must 'bear one another's burdens.' St. Paul understood this and he said, "...in my flesh I complete what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body. the Church." Some Christians will object, insisting that what Jesus Christ won was once and for all. It is true that Jesus pronounced, "It is finished." Jesus indeed won for us the perfect work of our redemption. But at the same time it was just a beginning because, at that moment, Christ gave out to us, through the Holy Spirit, a share in his own life, death and resurrection. He transferred to us all that he had won. So at the end of his earthy ministry he said, "It is finished," and transferred his redemptive work to the Holy Spirit. And the Holy Spirit applies to the saints and to all of us what Christ won through his life, death and resurrection. We see the Church exercising the authority Moses exercised at Mt. Sinai: the right and the duty to call on the merits of the saints. The Church has distributed these merits by attaching them to prayers, works and sacrifices that build up Christ's body. They range from giving up smoking for a day to undertaking a pilgrimage to the Holy Land.

When the Church speaks of indulgences, she speaks of them in the context of 'enjoying the full benefits of the family.' We are free to do so because of God. God is just, merciful, and indulgent. He is our Father. And He has arranged everything, even the supernatural, as a family affair. His family. His life.



We print our own church bulletins, and each week the center page must be "stuffed" into them. We have several two-member teams who take turns assembling the bulletins. They usually work for 30 to 60 minutes on a Friday morning about once a month.

Church Collection Counters

Teams of four people count the weekend collection each Monday morning at 9 a.m. The teams are scheduled on a rotating basis and serve about once a month.

Our Parish Purpose Statement - Saints Peter & Paul Parish

Our Pastoral Council has been working intensely with Father Tom to develop a Pastoral Plan for our parish. Parish Pastoral Planning is a prayerful and participative process through which a parish characterizes itself as a particular community of faith by developing its own purpose statement, assessing its strengths and resources, as well as its limitations and needs. All of this leads to making recommendations to the pastor concerning establishment of priorities and goals, and devising ways to accomplish its mission. Parish Pastoral Planning helps to answer the questions: Who are we as a parish? What are we called to do? How are we best going to do it?

All of us are called to participate fully in the life and mission of the Church. The mission of the Church is rooted in the mission of Christ who commanded everyone - clergy, religious, and laity - to "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." (Mark 16:15). From its earliest days the Church has responded to this mission in various ways depending upon the times and circumstances.

Creating this statement of our parish's purpose was a great challenge. The council could have simply quoted the parish purpose from the great commission of Matthew 28: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." Jesus' commission rings loud, yet there is great need in the world for the Catholic faithful to be moved to a renewed zest for the gospel, both personally and in sharing it with others. By establishing a purpose statement for our parish, the council hopes to eliminate any question as to our parish's sacred purpose, and to ensure that the work of the parish, in all its forms, is directed toward this purpose.

Our parish purpose statement:

Our sacred purpose as Saints Peter and Paul Parish is to . . .

use our God-given gifts . . .

Every parishioner is called upon to exercise the divinely-inspired calling and gifts conferred in Baptism for a particular function in carrying out the mission of Jesus Christ.

to awaken faith, inspire discipleship, and trust in God's plan . . .

Being a member of Saints Peter & Paul Parish is not only aimed at one's personal sanctity. We are called to bring Christ out into the world, wherever our journey takes us, to affect the sanctity of all people. Each of us is to exude our Catholic faith as to rouse faith in others, to be an example of Christian discipleship, and to exemplify trust in God's divine plan in all things.

so that all who enter our doors may receive, believe, and share God's love.

Whether one "enters our doors" by simply coming into contact with a parish member, or physically passes through the doors of our church building, our purpose is the same: To stir the hearts of people, through the power of the Holy Spirit, to become open to receive all the Lord unconditionally offers to every person, to attain certainty in the Gospel message, and to share in God's love by embracing his love personally and becoming a vessel in bringing his love to others.
