As I reflect on the joys of Easter, my thoughts turn back to one of the ancient homilies on Holy Saturday. --Fr. Tom

There was a great silence on the earth, a great stillness. The whole earth kept silence because the King was asleep. God has died in the flesh and hell trembles with fear. He has gone in search of our first parents as for a lost sheep. The Lord approached them, bearing the cross, the weapon that had won him the victory. At the sight of him, Adam, the first man he had created, cried out to everyone, "My Lord be with you all!" Christ answered him, "And with your spirit." Jesus took him by the hand and raised him up saying, "Awake, O sleeper, and rise from the dead and Christ will give you light."

I am your God who for your sake has become your son. For the sake of you, who left a garden, I was betrayed to the Jews in a garden, and I was crucified in a garden. See on my face the spittle I received in order to restore to you the life I once breathed into you. See there the marks of the blows I received in order to refashion your warped nature in my image. On my back see the marks of the scourging I endured to remove the burden of sin that weighs on your back. See my hands, nailed firmly to a tree, for you who once wickedly stretched out your hand to a tree. Rise, let us leave this place. The enemy led you out of the earthy paradise. I will not restore you to that paradise, but I will enthrone you in heaven.
