Lent and Scholastica

God calls all of us to listen to his Son, Jesus Christ, and to follow him. This we are all striving to do. Yet I have to admit that I, like many of you, have my favorite passages in scripture. These we listen to and seek to follow. We also have our less favorite passages. These we tend to ignore or read quickly as we move on to other passages. But those we tend to skip over may be ones we need to listen to more carefully.

Such was the case today. Jesus told his followers. "Hear me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile." We all nod and say ves. Jesus goes on, "...From within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly. All these come from within, and they defile." Now we squirm a little. But we don't want to argue with Jesus! So we say, "Yes, but..." or "I am only human!" or we just quickly turn the page to a different passage.

Before we move on too quickly, let us spend a little time here. Let us acknowledge that we could all use some work on our souls. Let us recognize that while we may be able to easily say that murder or blasphemy or adultery or theft or others may not apply to us, we need to acknowledge that evil thoughts often will. Even for those times in which they are kept silent inside our screaming minds. Our Lord said it comes from their hearts, not out of their mouths. So it includes silent thoughts as well.

Evil thoughts. How many times have I silently (or not so silently) raged in anger at a politician? Or a coworker? Or my boss? Or someone else? How many times have I envied the well-being of another? How many times have looked at another with a lack of chastity? And the list goes on. All of us have areas that need our attention. The saints can be a big help. Instead of excusing myself with " am only human!" or some other excuse, look at the saints. They too were only human. But they became saints. So can we.

Just today, February 10, we had the feast day of St. Scholastica, the twin sister of St. Benedict. She saw him only once a year, and she desired him to stay longer to speak of God and spiritual matters. He refused and insisted on returning to his monastery. Scholastica prayed to God, who sent a huge storm which kept Benedict from leaving. St. Gregory said of Scholastica, "She could do more because she loved more."

In a few days we will be starting Lent. Often we are thinking, "What will I give up this year?" This year may I suggest that we look inside at our heart? What is there that God would ask us to let go of? What do we need to work on to be able to "do more because we love more?"

February 14, 2021— World Marriage Day

World Marriage Day (WMD) honors husband and wife as the foundation of the family - the basic unit of society. It salutes the beauty of their faithfulness, sacrifice, and joy in daily married life.

The idea of celebrating marriage began in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, in 1981, when couples encouraged the mayor, the governor, and the Bishop to proclaim St. Valentine's Day as "We Believe in Marriage Day." The event was so successful that the idea was presented to and adopted by Worldwide Marriage Encounter's National Leadership.

By 1982, 43 governors officially proclaimed the day, and celebrations spread to U.S. military bases in several foreign countries. In 1983, the name was changed to "World Marriage Day," designated to be celebrated each year on the second Sunday in February. In 1993, his Holiness, Pope John Paul II, imparted his Apostolic Blessing on World Marriage Day (WMD). WMD celebrations continue to grow and spread to more countries and faith expressions every year.



Our World Marriage Day symbol speaks readily of the role and values we proclaim. Husband and wife are symbolically seen as two candle-like figures, reminding us that married love calls us to help enlighten the world.

The couple is joined by a heart, focusing on love as the power that fosters unity within the couple and generates the capacity to be life-giving and inspire others to fruitfulness and unity.

Lenten Regulations for Fasting & Abstinence

The Church teaches that Catholics in good health are to observe the following practices during Lent unless for some serious reason they are unable to

Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In addition, all Catholics 14 years old or older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting as explained by the U.S. bishops means partaking of only one full meal and two smaller meals that do not equal the main meal. Abstinence forbids the use of meat, but not of eggs, milk products, or condiments made of animal fat.

The meaning of ashes on Ash Wednesday

Blessed ashes placed on the forehead hint at the ancient ritual of covering oneself with ashes in penitence. Receiving the cross-shaped "smudge" reminds us that we are dust and is a public statement of repentance. The priest, deacon, or other minister uses one of these formulas as he applies the ashes:

"Repent and believe in the Gospel."

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Stations of the Cross

In the early Church, Christians would make a pilgrimage to the Holy Land to retrace the steps of Jesus on his way to the cross. As the Church grew, such a pilgrimage became unrealistic, and a tradition was born to retrace the steps of Jesus by reflecting on pictures that depicted those steps. During Lent, especially on Fridays, Catholics reflect on the crucifixion of Jesus by praying the Stations of the Cross, which has become a time-honored tradition.
