Protect Life!

I typically stay away from political issues. There is so much to say about our faith and belief in God. But there are times when social justice issues become very important and we must speak out. One of those times is now, in the issue of our prayer and work for the protection of human life. Beginning in 1976, members of Congress and the White House have consistently supported the Hyde Amendment, a federal policy which has prevented taxpayer dollars from paying for elective abortions. This language has been approved every year since then, regardless of which political party has been in control of Congress or the presidency. In addition to wide legislative support, the general public is highly in favor of the Hyde Amendment and similar provisions. Many public opinion surveys demonstrate that a strong majority of individuals in our country including those of different income levels, races, and positions regarding abortion—oppose using tax dollars to pay for abortion.

Despite public opinion, pro-abortion groups and certain elected officials are campaigning to rescind the Hyde Amendment and to instead implement a policy that would require every federal health program to cover, and every federal health facility to provide, elective abortions. If adopted, the new policy would go as far as to nullify state and local policies against abortion coverage, rescinding the compromise policy agreed to by President Obama and Congressional Democrats in the Affordable Care Act of 2010

The stakes are high, as the Hyde Amendment saves the lives of mothers and children and respects the consciences of the American people. It is estimated that over 2.4 million children are alive now due to the Hyde Amendment. If Hyde and similar measures are not approved in this year's appropriations process, billions of taxpayer dollars could start being used for elective abortions in this country.

If you have not yet signed the petition for no taxpayer funds for the abortion industry, please do so now. It is at www.NoTaxpayerAbortion.com. In addition please contact your representatives and voice your opposition to this grievous assault on human life. Here in our area, they are Representative Peter Meijer, Senator Debbie Stabenow, and Senator Gary Peters. Please encourage other family and friends to join with you. The House Committee on Appropriations is finalizing their work on the Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, and Related Agencies appropriations bill. As it stands now, the Hyde Amendment and other longstanding, bipartisan provisions are not included.

Please voice your opposition today. Don't leave it for tomorrow. Let our voices be in favor of God's gift of life.

Confirmation Classes for 9th Grade Faith Formation Students begin Sunday, August 1st, 10:15 to 11:15 a.m. in the Veritas Room. We lost much class time due to the pandemic, so earlier this year decided to begin our final preparations for Confirmation early. (We anticipate Confirmation will take place in late October or early November, depending on the date set by the Diocese.)

In the meantime, here's what families can do to help their Confirmand this summer:

- Review the lessons from last year's classes. (Students should have their textbooks, *Decision Point*, at home.)
- 2. Ask students to prayerfully consider what the Sacrament of Confirmation means to them, and why they want to be confirmed.
- 3. Reflect on the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit. How will receiving the fullness of these gifts help the student in his/her life?
- 4. Ask students to think about any questions they have about the Catholic faith, and instruct them to jot them down in their folder to address with their sponsor, parents, or in class.
- 5. If the Confirmand hasn't yet chosen a sponsor, they should do so as soon as possible.
- 6. Has he/she chosen a Confirmation name? Again, if not, now is the time!
- 7. How are students doing on community service hours? The parish garage sale (see article on the next page) is a great opportunity!

We look forward to seeing all of our 9th grade Confirmation students on Sunday, August 1st. Be sure to bring your textbooks and folders with you!

World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly Next Sunday, July 25

Pope Francis announced in late January that he was establishing a "World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly," which is to be celebrated each year on the fourth Sunday of July to coincide with the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, Jesus' grandparents.

To express the closeness of God and of the Church to every older person, Pope Francis has chosen "I am with you always" from the Gospel of Matthew as the theme for the first World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. The theme is especially appropriate "in these challenging pandemic times," said the announcement from the Dicastery for Laity, the Family and Life.

"I am with you always' is also a promise of closeness and hope that young and old can mutually share. Not only are grandchildren and young people called upon to be present in the lives of older people, but older people and grandparents also have a mission of evangelization, proclamation and prayer, and of encouraging young people in their faith," the statement said.

"In the encyclical, 'Fratelli Tutti,' the Holy Father reminds us that no one is saved alone. With this in mind, we must treasure the spiritual and human wealth that has been handed down from generation to generation," he said.
