The Assumption of Mary, the Mother of God

On Monday, the 15th of August, we celebrate the Assumption of Mary, the Mother of God, into heaven. Although this was not declared a part of the official doctrine of our Church until November 1, 1950, our Church Fathers and great Doctors spoke of this as something already familiar and accepted by the faithful. Their preaching gave it even greater clarity. They used profound arguments in setting out its nature and meaning. Above all, they brought out more clearly for us the fact that what we commemorate in this feast day is not simply the total absence of corruption from the dead body of the Blessed Virgin Mary, but much more. It is her triumph over death and her glorification in heaven, following the path set for her by her only Son, Jesus Christ.

Saint John Damascene, born about 675, speaks with eloquence when he relates the bodily assumption of the loving Mother of God to her other gifts and privileges: *"It was necessary that she who had carried the Creator as a child on her breast should dwell in the tabernacles of God. It was necessary that the bride espoused by the Father should make her home in the bridal chambers of heaven. It was necessary that she, who had gazed on her crucified Son and been pierced in the heart by the sword of sorrow which she had escaped in giving him birth, should contemplate him seated with the Father. It was necessary that the Mother of God should share in the possessions of her Son, and be venerated by every creature as the Mother and handmaid of God."*

Saint Germanus of Constantinople considered it in keeping not only with her divine motherhood, but also with the unique sanctity of her virginal body, that it was incorrupt and carried up to heaven: "In the words of Scripture, you appear in beauty. Your virginal body is entirely holy, entirely chaste, entirely the house of God, so for this reason also it is henceforth a stranger to decay: a body changed, because a human body, to a preeminent life of incorruptibility, but still a living body, excelling in splendor, a body inviolate and sharing the perfection of life."

The Assumption of Mary fills us with joy. It encourages us along the way still remaining for us before we reach heaven. It gives us courage and energy to reach the sanctity we are called to by our vocation. As we struggle to be good sons and daughters of God, let us make an effort to keep our souls clean through confession and the Eucharist. If we die in God's grace, we will go to heaven and receive our eternal reward.

TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Bishop Walkowiak has directed the priests in our diocese to begin offering 2 Communion cups with the Precious Blood at each of our weekend Masses. Here is the Communion distribution plan approved by Fr. Tom for our parish, beginning Saturday, August 13:

-3 Ministers of Communions (EMs) are assigned for each weekend Mass. The EMs come up at the Lamb of God and sanitize their hands. 1 EM stands along the ambo side of the altar, 2 EMs along the chair side. After receiving Communion from the Priest or Deacon, the EMs are handed either a bread plate or a Communion cup for distribution.

-Priest and Deacon stand at the center aisle, one step up, each with a ciborium of hosts. People in the center sections and the "Mary section" approach by the center aisle and return by the side aisles.

—One EM stands at the St. Joseph section wall aisle with a ciborium of hosts. People in that section approach by the wall aisle and return by the side aisle. (When that EM finishes offering the hosts, he/she ministers to the musicians in the music area or choir loft, then immediately returns the ciboria to the altar.)

-Two EMs stand at the side aisles, one step up, with the Precious Blood. People who have already received the Body of Christ may, if they choose, receive from the cup before heading back down the side aisles to their seats. If not receiving from the cup, they may immediately head back down the side aisle; no need to wait for persons receiving from the cup.

After Communion, EMs return all vessels to the altar. Priest will consume any remaining Precious Blood and purify the vessels.
