One of the comments that came out of our Synod meetings reflected on how well our Church is doing and how well we are living up to our mission call. "Sometimes the Church herself doesn't know her own mission: We are given mixed signals; we need to unify our mission, make it solid within our own parishes before we can evangelize it to others." So, let us look at ourselves.

Our mission, of course, is to proclaim and follow Jesus Christ. We are a community of believers who span the globe. Our very name, "catholic", means universal. Our core beliefs are summed up in our Creed. "I believe in one God..." We are the original Christian Church, which began when Jesus said to Peter, "You are the rock on which I will build my Church. The gates of hell will not prevail against it." Every pope since Peter, our first pope, has been part of an unbroken line of succession.

At the Last Supper, Jesus said, "Take this and eat this is my Body; take this and drink—this is my Blood." In this, He gave us the Eucharist, the gift of his real presence in the form of bread and wine. The word 'Eucharist' means thanksgiving. The Mass is a Eucharistic celebration and a celebration of God's words to us in the Scriptures.

We believe that holy men and women who came before us still pray for us and aid us. We call them saints, and many of our churches are named after them. The first among the saints was Mary, who gave birth to Jesus and is honored as Mother of God and Mother of the Church. From the beginning, the Catholic Church has handed on God's Word to each new generation and defined what it means to be a follower of Jesus. Through the centuries, the Church has preserved the Bible, as well as many other works, in its monasteries and libraries. It instituted the university system in order to educate.

We also believe that beauty is a sign of God's loving presence, so we have commissioned and preserved some of the world's greatest works of art. Without the sponsorship of the Church, Michelangelo would never have painted the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel or carved the Pieta.

Today the Church is the world's largest charitable organization. We provide a significant portion of the social service needs of Americans and others around the world. We have hundreds of Catholic hospitals, universities, and colleges in the United States. We also operate the nation's largest non-public school system. Catholics are well over a billion people on every continent, and we have professed and expressed our faith in Jesus Christ for over 2000 years.

Soon we will be returning to our Catholic schools, our Faith Formation programs, our Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, Bible studies, and other programs. We have great things to share. The greatest is God and all He has done for us, especially at Mass, the greatest "hidden treasure" in all of history. Jesus makes himself available upon the altar, in every language, in every corner of the world... humble, accessible, and consumable.

## Scheduling Your Photography Session

For the next five weekends after Mass, we will be signing up parishioners to have their pictures taken for our new directory. If you would like to schedule your photography appointment online, simply go to www.ucdir.com, click on photography appointment scheduling login on the right side, enter mi1643 in the Church Code field and enter photos in the Church Password field.

Follow the prompts to schedule your family's appointment time. If you have 6 or more in your family, please use 2 consecutive time slots. The online scheduling option is available Monday through Friday. Appointments fill up quickly, so schedule as soon as possible to secure your preferred date and time. We want everyone to be a part of our directory, so be sure to sign up!

## Are you away from home a lot during the summer-or the winter? Would you like to try giving to the offertory electronically?

We have a very simple form to fill out which asks for your banking information, how often you would like to give (weekly, bi-weekly, or monthly), and how much you would like to contribute. We use this to build our ACH batches through Mercantile Bank, and the funds are transferred automatically at the chosen time. Once you have signed up, your work is done. You can change or halt the process at any time with a phone call to the parish office. Isaac Fletcher, an 11 year old SSPP parishioner, is in need of a kidney transplant and looking for a living kidney donor with Type O blood. His kidneys failed in 2019, and he is dependent on dialysis, which keeps him alive, but not healthy. With a living donor, the transplanted kidney usually lasts much longer, the wait to receive the kidney is shorter (often by years!), a closer match is possible to reduce organ rejection (and the level of immune suppression needed), and overall quality of life is higher. The donor is able to live a normal, healthy life with just one kidney, and costs of the evaluation and surgery are covered.
