"It is He Who is to baptize with the Holy Spirit." (John 1:33)

Many people today talk about being "baptized in the Spirit." By this, they usually mean having a renewal of their life in the Spirit. However, the Bible considers being baptized in the Spirit the same as being baptized, and not as a renewal of life in the Spirit. Thus, many people use the phrase "baptized in the Spirit" in an un-Biblical

Although these people are wrongly using biblical terminology, they are "correct" pastorally. We have a great need to renew our being baptized in the Spirit. Through sin and selfishness, many baptized people have stifled and saddened the Holy Spirit. If we are to live our Catholic life as the Lord intended it to be lived, we must stir into flame the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Today's Scriptural readings invite us to renew our life in the Spirit. Look at Jesus, the Lamb of God. Let Him free you as He freed the Israelites from slavery in Egypt. Let Him take away your sins and the sins of the world. "Follow the Lamb wherever He goes." Be pure and uncompromising with the ways of the world.

To follow the Lamb can be difficult at times. We all have times when we are discouraged. There are times when we ask ourselves, "Why am I doing this?" There are times when we say, "I cannot keep on with this." There are times when we really just want to throw in the towel and guit. During times like these, we need to spend some time with our Lord. Remember how our Lord went away from the disciples and spent time in prayer with his Father in heaven? Let us do the same. Also, our Lord left us a gift - the gift of the Mass! We listen carefully to the scripture readings. We receive the gift of Holy Com-

Let us also remember the gift of the offertory at Mass. When the priest takes our gifts of bread and wine and offers them to God, remember to add your gifts there as well. Your conquests, your defeats, your challenges, all that is going on in your life. You silently place them on the paten and in the chalice. Offer them to almighty God, who loves you so very much, receives your gifts, and pours out his graces on you.

So let us receive a renewal of being baptized in the Spirit today. Let us offer ourselves to the Lord. Let us receive from Him these gifts of bread and wine which have become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

May God fill you with his grace and blessings.


