### Lenten Confession

Have you gone to confession yet? Lent is a time of year that places great emphasis on the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Jesus appeared to the disciples in the upper room on Easter night, breathed on them and said, "Peace be with you. As the Father sent Me, so I send you." As He said this, He breathed on them, adding, Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven, and whose sins you retain are retained." Notice that Jesus did this by breathing on them. The only other time we read this is when God breathed life into the first human beings He created. This speaks of the power of the symbol and the power given to the Apostles. Just as God breathed life into the human body, the followers of Jesus were to breathe new life into those damaged by sin! Notice also that they had the power to forgive and the power to not forgive. This means the disciples had to hear the confessions in order to know whether to forgive them or hold them bound.

Many say that they confess directly to God, while Catholics confess to a priest, but this is wrong. Catholics always confess their sins to God. They do it directly as well as through His ministers because that is what God requires. Look at St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians in chapter 5: "Whoever is in Christ is a new creation...All this is from God, who has reconciled us to Himself through Christ and given us a ministry of reconciliation, not counting their trespasses against them and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. So we are ambassadors for Christ, as if God were appealing through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God." What does this mean other than that they share in the ministry of Christ and forgive sins in His name?

James also makes it clear that the sins of the sick are forgiven in the Sacrament of Anointing. He specifies that the priests are to be called. They obviously had power the ordinary Christian did not, the power to forgive sins. Otherwise why didn't James just ask ordinary fellow Christians to pray over the sick, as is the case in numerous other passages?

Jesus said to the Apostles, "As the Father sent Me, so I send you." The Apostles are to continue the mission of Christ. The essence of that mission is the forgiveness of sins. Jesus knows us. He provided sacramental confession to give us humility, the certainty of forgiveness, and help to overcome self-deception and rationalization in matters of sin. Christ gave his disciples the power to forgive sin. This power is intended to be passed on, since Christ knew people would sin until the end of time.

Bishop Walkowiak has directed all pastors to be in the confessional from 5-8 p.m. on March  $23^{rd}$ . I will be at SS. Peter & Paul. Other opportunities include 11 a.m. to Noon on Mondays and Wednesdays and 3 to 3:50 p.m. on Saturdays. Thursdays I will be at St. Edward at 6:30 p.m. In addition, Sundays are from 3 to 5 p.m. at St. Edward on March  $19^{th}$  and April  $2^{nd}$ ,and at SS. Peter & Paul on March  $26^{th}$ . 




