Prayer Chain

Frequently we run into a friend or acquaintance who asks us to pray for them or a family member. We assure them we will, but do we? We meant to, but soon we have forgotten about it. Let us take a lesson from Jesus in the gospels. We read in Luke that Christ went up to the hills to pray. Sometimes He prayed at night, and other times the Apostles came looking for Him and found Him deep in prayer. Jesus was often deep in prayer, united with His heavenly Father in intimate and confident prayer. That Jesus Christ, who is perfect God and perfect man, should pray for us, gives us an example of prayer that is humble, confident, and persevering. He commanded us to pray always, without losing heart.

Jesus made His prayer to God His Father, and God always heard Him. We see this over and over. After the death of Lazarus, his sister Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died; and even now I know that whatever you ask from God, God will give you." Just before Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead, He prayed, "Father, I thank you because you have heard Me. I know that you always hear Me, but because of the crowd here I have said this, that they may believe."

Before His passion, Jesus prayed for Peter: "Simon, Simon, Satan demanded to have you that he may sift you like wheat; but I have prayed for you that your faith may not fail, and when you have turned again, strengthen your brethren." Peter did indeed fall, but he repented, turned back, and prayed for the others. Likewise, Jesus prayed for all the Apostles and for us at the Last Supper, "I do not pray that you should take them out of the world, but that you should keep them from the evil one." Jesus knows so well the discouragement we will have, but had confidence in the power of His prayers. His prayers gave strength to the Apostles, even to the point of giving up their lives. Jesus also prays for us to remain faithful and confident in his love.

Let us strive to do better. We know that Jesus, seated at the right hand of His Father in heaven, continues to pray for us. He remains always as our advocate and mediator. He pleads for us to His Father, and He knows that His prayer cannot be refused. What a joy to know that Jesus prays for us!!! Our prayers, weak and distracted though they are, will be joined with His prayers and gain infinite value. Infinite value! How can we then not pray with confidence to our Lord?

Let us then pray with renewed fervor. Let us ask Jesus to inspire us that our prayers, springing from our hearts, may be one with His for all eternity. Let us also take our prayers to our Blessed Mother Mary and other saints in heaven. Then, united with them, they are given to Jesus and passed on to the Father. Even when we don't think our prayers are being heard, St. John of the Cross taught that "a little of this pure love is more precious before God and does great good for the Church." It does more good than any and all other works that are without Christ. St. John Vianney said that all the evils that oppress us on earth come from not praying or from not praying well. Let us then renew our desire to turn to God with love and trust. Let us have the joy of living our life close to God. It is the only place where it is worth our while to live.
