#### A reflection by Fr. Oscar on Luke 6:20-26

Raising his eyes toward his disciples Jesus said:

"Blessed are you who are poor, for the Kingdom of God is yours. Blessed are you who are now hungry. for you will be satisfied. Blessed are you who are now weeping, for you will laugh. Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude and insult you, and denounce your name as evil on account of the Son of Man.

Rejoice and leap for joy on that day! Behold, your reward will be great in heaven. For their ancestors treated the prophets in the same way.

But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation. But woe to you who are filled now. for you will be hungry. Woe to you who laugh now. for you will grieve and weep. Woe to you when all speak well of you. for their ancestors treated the false prophets in this way."

Jesus' best sermon in the Gospels is undoubtedly His sermon on the Beatitudes. In Luke it is known as the Sermon on the Plain. In six verses, the early Jewish-Christian Lukan community collected Jesus' feelings and dreams. The Beatitudes are the highest spiritual expression of Christianity.

Luke's version exalts the value of the poor, in line with the teachings of the Old Testament. One is poor in order to be filled with the absolute. When God is the center, we gravitate around Him, and not around wealth or fame that would put us at risk of living impoverished by the idolatry of self.

Luke was thinking of the hungry and those who suffered under the rigors of the Roman Empire. These beatitudes suggest that in the name of God and with him alone, we can overthrow the causes that make many unhappy. There will come a day when we will laugh and be satisfied. It is a dream that we are realizing daily.

In the process of building a new world, the commitment of Christians will bring persecution and martyrdom. Suffering in order to build the Kingdom of God softens us and pushes us to dream of the happiness that one day we will live.

What better place than in our church and at Mass to renew our commitment to love and to give ourselves in service that will make us happy forever.

Let us offer a prayer that all those who sow peace and justice will be blessed, and that beatitude may germinate.


