In today's Gospel, Jesus tells a story about a man who was leaving on a trip. He gave the servants he was leaving behind a gift of talents. To one he gave five talents, to another two talents, and to another just one talent. Why the different amounts? Why not leave the same amount with each of them? Would a parent give each child a different amount? No. To keep the peace, he or she would give each the same amount. But here, our Lord gives different amounts to different people. He did not want to give them the same, for then they would have the same responsibility. That would have been unjust. He gave to each according to his capacity. We know the end result. The one with five talents earned five more. The one with two talents earned two more. The master was well pleased and rewarded both of them.

We hope for the same. God has given us different talents and abilities: intelligence, ability to love, power to make others happy, temporal goods. We produce different results. The journey of the master in the parable is our Lord's time of leaving us in charge of His gifts here on earth. His unexpected return is our death, and the reward comes when we give an accounting to the Lord at the end of our life. Let us, then, examine our approach to the gifts God has given us. Do we think of ourselves as stewards? Or do we live under the illusion that we are the proud owners of what we possess, without any requirement to give Him an accounting?

Let us take some time to think about this. What is our attitude toward our body? Toward our senses? Do we really use them to give glory to God, or not? Do we make contributions to the good of our church? Of our society? What about our friendships? Jesus Christ wants to see that His gifts to us are well used. The reward He will give to each of us will be in direct proportion to the gifts He entrusted to us. The Gospel of Matthew tells us, "To everyone who has, more will be given, and he will grow rich." Our Lord is pleased, but we need to be careful. For what humans see as much, the Lord may see as very little. When God invites them to enter into His joy, it is because He sees that a great deal has been accomplished.

We surely want to be found vigilant when our Lord Jesus returns for us. Nothing could be more important than that. So, let us make good use of the time we have to get ready for Him. It will please him very much. May we be able to say, "I have lived my life for your glory!"

Zion Community Food Pantry

Blessings and many thanks to each of you for the support you have given us in the past. We are writing to you today to let you know how things are going for the pantry.

It has taken most of the year to get the word out about our move, even though we had it on television, on the radio, in the newspaper, on Facebook, and on signs along the way. Most people are finally getting to us, and we have been gaining many new participants due to the rising cost of food and living expenses.

There has also been a change in Meijer's Simply Give program. Instead of supporting only one local pantry, they have decided to support more pantries. This means that currently we are receiving these monies (food cards) twice a year instead of 4-5 times a year, and it could be cut to once a year. This is a huge hit to our ability to purchase food and is also impacting where and how we get food. It is also going to affect what we are able to give out and how much.

Feeding America of West Michigan has also been a low-cost supplier of food for our pantries, but their supply is also dwindling because of the demand.

We are so very appreciative of all our supporters, whether you give a can of veggies, \$2, or \$2,000. We cannot do this work without the caring people of our community. God bless you!
