"On the night He was betrayed, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke the bread and gave it to his disciples and said, 'Take and eat, this is My Body.' Then He took the cup, gave thanks and said. 'Take and drink. this is Mv Blood."

Since Christ Himself has declared the bread to be His Body, who can have any further doubt? Since He Himself has said, quite categorically, this is My Blood, who would dare to question it and say it is not His Blood? Therefore, it is with complete assurance that we receive the Bread and the Wine as the Body and the Blood of Christ. His Body is given to us under the appearance of bread, and His Blood is given to us under the appearance of wine, in order to make us, by receiving them, one Body and Blood with Him. Having His Body and Blood in ourselves, we become bearers of Christ. As St. Peter savs, we are sharers in the divine nature.

This is important to remember. Normally when we eat food, it becomes part of us. The consumed food becomes our muscle and our bone. It is now part of our body. When we consume the Body and Blood of Jesus. that does not happen! Instead we become part of Him. We, our body and soul, become part of the Body of Christ. Jesus focused on this. In the Gospel of John, Chapter 6. He insisted, "Unless you eat My Flesh and drink My Blood you shall have no life in you." This horrified many of His followers. They thought He was encouraging them to practice cannibalism. So they left Him. Jesus let them leave! He didn't call them back! He didn't explain that He didn't really mean it, that it was just a symbol! Instead, He turned to His Apostles and asked them if they also wanted to leave. They didn't understand either. But they stayed. As St. Peter said, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that You are the Holy One of God."

Do not, then, regard the Eucharist as ordinary bread and wine. They are, in fact, the Body and Blood of the Lord, as He Himself declared. Whatever your senses may tell you, be strong in the faith. You have been taught, and you are firmly convinced, that what looks and tastes like bread and wine is not bread and wine, but the Body and Blood of Christ.

This is of great importance. Sometimes, someone will get upset with something the priest says or does. Or the music minister. Or the secretary. Or someone else in the parish. So they leave the parish. Think about this! Are you really ready to leave behind the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ because of something a human being has said or done?

Many years ago I did this. But I came back. I came back because I missed the Body and Blood of Jesus. What about you?


