Jesus is alive! He is alive! He is risen!

It has been a week since we celebrated that Jesus Christ is risen and alive. He appears to his Apostles, who at first don't believe. They think they are seeing a ghost. But they are not. He really is alive. They see him, touch him, watch him eat, and then, finally convinced, they rejoice in talking with him. But there was one missing. Thomas was not there. So, a week later, Jesus comes again and has to convince Thomas that he is real, that he is alive. Thomas replies, "My Lord and My God!" This faith of ours is real. It is not subjective, but objective. It is a real, deep, and practical relationship with our living Lord who died and then rose for us.

The Apostles had gone to Galilee, where Jesus would meet with them. They were excited to see Jesus, but also fearful. Peter was afraid because he had denied knowing Jesus. The others were afraid because they had run away when Jesus was arrested. It is much the same for us. We have done things in our lives that greatly offend Jesus. We love him, but we are also embarrassed. We want to see him, yet we stay at a distance. We wonder what his first words to us will be.

This is why we have the feast day of Divine Mercy Sunday. Coming on the very first Sunday after Easter, it proclaims that the mercy of Jesus is unlimited and available even to the greatest sinners. He invites us to trust him. He taught us, through Sister Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun, "Jesus, I trust in you!" Our Lord said, "Do you think you have written enough about my divine mercy? What you have written is but a drop in the ocean. I am Love and Mercy itself. There is no misery that could be a match for my mercy; neither will misery exhaust it, because it is being granted. It even increases. The soul which will trust in my mercy is most fortunate because I myself take care of it."

So Jesus' love for us is infinite. But He does not force himself on us. He invites. He pleads. He even begs us to come and seek his mercy. But he does not force it. "Today I am sending you with my mercy to the whole world," says our Lord. "I do not want to punish mankind, but I desire to heal it, pressing it to my merciful heart. I use punishment when they themselves force me to do so. My hand is reluctant to take hold of the sword of justice. Before the day of justice I am sending the day of mercv."

Jesus sends us his mercy. Remember the story in the Bible about the prodigal son? How the youngest son went off wasting his inheritance and then, broke and penniless, decides to return home? He did not yet have mercy. First he had to return home. We return home when we come to the sacrament of Confession. Second, the prodigal son spoke of being treated as a slave, saving he no longer deserved to be treated as a son, and asked for forgiveness. We come into the confessional and acknowledge our sins. "Forgive me for I have sinned. My sins are. . . " It was then that the father extended forgiveness. Jesus grants us forgiveness. He proclaims us to be a child of heaven and pours out grace on us. Let us proclaim his love and mercy, saving "Jesus. I trust in you!"

SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER (DIVINE MERCY)

Message of Divine Mercy

In the 1920s and 1930s, Jesus frequently appeared to a young Polish nun, Sr. Faustina Kowalska, speaking to her of his Divine Mercy. He asked her to proclaim his mercy everywhere by means of devotions he revealed to her: the image of Divine Mercy, the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy, the Feast of Divine Mercy, and the novena in preparation for the feast. In the Jubilee Year 2000, Pope John Paul II canonized Sr. Faustina and proclaimed that the Sunday after Easter would henceforth be celebrated as the Feast of the Divine Mercy. In 2002, the Church announced that a plenary indulgence would be granted to the faithful who, under the usual conditions of Confession, Communion, and prayers for the Holy Father, "would observe this day with intense devotion."

The image of Divine Mercy is one of the risen Christ clothed in a white garment, with his right hand raised in blessing. His left hand is touching his garment near his heart, from which two large rays come forth, one red and the other pale. The two rays denote the blood and water which came forth from Jesus' side when it was pierced by a lance, signifying the cleansing and life-giving sacraments made available to us through Jesus' perfect sacrifice on the cross. Under the image are inscribed these words: Jesus. I Trust in You.

The Second Sunday of Easter is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. The **Chaplet of the Divine**Mercy is a beautiful prayer form that invokes God's mercy on ourselves and others. It is prayed using traditional rosary beads in the following manner:

- 1. Begin by praying 3 times: O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You.
- 2. Pray one Our Father, one Hail Mary, and the Apostles' Creed.
- 3. On the single "Our Father" beads before each decade, pray: Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of your dearly beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.
- 4. On the ten "Hail Mary" beads of each decade, pray: For the sake of his sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.
- 5. End the chaplet by praying three times: Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

You may pray the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy at any time. Some people pray it as part of a Novena from Good Friday through the eve of Divine Mercy Sunday. Others pray it daily at the 3:00 p.m. "Hour of Mercy", when Jesus died on the cross.
