Pentecost

For several weeks we have been celebrating our Lord's Resurrection. Indeed, it is huge for us. His Resurrection is the cause of joy both for Jesus, who is alive, and for us as a promise of our future entry into everlasting life. Then, last Sunday, we focused on our Lord's Ascension into heaven. We celebrated that day when our poor human nature was carried up, as very much a part of Jesus Christ, above all the hosts of heaven, past the angels, to the very throne of God the Father. It is in this divine act of Jesus, along with the Father and the Holy Spirit, that the grace of God shows itself more marvelous. Jesus promised to send the Holy Spirit.

This Holy Spirit, poured out on the faithful people, brought them to a faith that does not fail, a hope that is not shaken, and a charity that does not grow cold. Our Redeemer's visible presence was passed into the Holy Spirit and poured out on us in the sacraments. Our faith is nobler and stronger because sight has been replaced by a doctrine whose authority is accepted by believing hearts. Strengthened by our Lord's Ascension and strengthened by the Holy Spirit, it would remain unshaken by imprisonment, exile, fire, and the most brutal tortures devised by angry men. Believing men and women, as well as girls and boys, made such progress in the love of God that they found joy in what had terrified them before. They were able to fix their attention on Christ and his Divinity as He sat at the right hand of the Father. They recognized that He had not abandoned them when He returned to heaven.

The truth is that the Son of Man was also revealed as the Son of God in a more perfect way once He entered into His Father's glory. He was now even more present in His Divinity to those from whom He was removed in his humanity. A more mature faith enabled them to stretch their minds upward to the Son in his equality with the Father. We no longer needed the contact with Christ's tangible body, wonderful as it was. The Holy Spirit was poured out on us.

This Holy Spirit, whose nature is always the same, pours out grace to each person as He wills. The Spirit never changes, but the effects of his actions are different and marvelous. He makes one person a teacher of divine truth, inspires another to prophesy, gives another the power to cast out demons, and another the power to interpret Holy Scripture! All from the same Spirit! Still another gains self-control, while another learns how to help the poor. Another is trained to fast, while another is trained for martyrdom. In each person, the Holy Spirit reveals his presence in a particular way for the common good of all. This Holy Spirit comes with the tenderness of a true friend. He enlightens the mind of one and then through him, the minds of others as well. Thus we study the writings of great scholars that our minds may grow in our love of the Holy Spirit, and of the Father and the Son as well. Through the Holy Spirit, we become citizens of Heaven. Of Heaven!!! What a most marvelous gift as we work to attain that for all eternity. Life in Heaven!
