We are all made in the image of God. This means that we should follow his example and try to be as much like him as we can. In his great love, before he came here, our Lord gave us St. John the Baptist to preach forgiveness of sins. St. John was preceded by many prophets who said the same thing. And when Jesus came, He repeatedly told people to "Come to Me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest." Jesus would heal, both physically and spiritually. He readily and eagerly forgave them of their sins. He told them parables illustrating his focus on forgiveness. From those who left deliberately, as in the Prodigal Son, to those who were simply lost, as in the man with a hundred sheep. Jesus not only called for their return, but he went in search of them. Even just one. When he still had 99, he left them in search of the one. He crossed valleys and thickets, climbed mountains, and spent hours and hours looking for the lost. When he finally found it, he didn't chastise it. He didn't drive it back with rough blows. He gently picked it up, placed it on his own shoulders, and carried it back to the flock with great joy.

Let us look carefully at this. The sheep is more than just a sheep. The shepherd is more than just a shepherd. They speak to us of our lives. We should not look on the lost, deliberately or accidentally, as beyond hope. We should not abandon them when they are in danger or be slow to come to their aid. When they turn away from the right path, we must search them out and bring them back. Rejoice at their return and welcome them back into the family. Help them to change, to become holy, to lead good and productive lives.

Brotherly love, which Jesus calls us to live, lies in love of friends and enemies. Especially enemies. We are called to be like our Lord, always gentle, meek and full of peace. Jesus was "led like a sheep to the slaughter, and like a lamb before the shearers, he kept silent. Even more, he prayed for them saying, "Father, forgive them." Is there any gentleness, any love, lacking in this Even more, Jesus made excuses for praver? them. "Father, forgive them for they do not know what they are doing!" They are sinners who are attacking Him, but they have little judgment; therefore, forgive them. They are nailing Him to the cross but they don't know who it is they are nailing; therefore, forgive them. They think he is an imposter claiming to be God. They don't recognize him, so forgive them.

If one seeks to love himself, he must not allow himself to be corrupted by indulging his sinful nature. If he wishes to overcome his sinfulness, he must enlarge the whole horizon of his love to contemplate the loving gentleness of our Lord. To savor brotherly love, he must extend it even to his enemies.

Let us keep the eyes of our souls always fixed on the serene patience and love of Jesus Christ.

Message of Divine Mercy

In the 1920s and 1930s, Jesus frequently appeared to a young Polish nun, Sr. Faustina Kowalska, speaking to her of his Divine Mercy. He asked her to proclaim his mercy everywhere by means of devotions he revealed to her: the image of Divine Mercy, the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy, the Feast of Divine Mercy, and the novena in preparation for the feast. In the Jubilee Year 2000, Pope John Paul II canonized Sr. Faustina and proclaimed that the Sunday after Easter would henceforth be celebrated as the Feast of the Divine Mercy. In 2002, the Church announced that a plenary indulgence would be granted to the faithful who, under the usual conditions of Confession, Communion, and prayers for the Holy Father, "would observe this day with intense devotion."

The image of Divine Mercy is one of the risen Christ clothed in a white garment, with his right hand raised in blessing. His left hand is touching his garment near his heart, from which two large rays come forth, one red and the other pale. The two rays denote the blood and water which came forth from Jesus' side when it was pierced by a lance, signifying the cleansing and life-giving sacraments made available to us through Jesus' perfect sacrifice on the cross. Under the image are inscribed these words: Jesus, I Trust in You.

The Chaplet of the Divine Mercy is a beautiful prayer form that invokes God's mercy on ourselves and others. It is prayed using traditional rosary beads in the following manner:

- 1. Begin with the Sign of the Cross, 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary, and the Apostles' Creed.
- 2. On the Our Father beads, say the following: Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, of Your dearly be loved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.
- 3. On the 10 Hail Mary beads, say the following: For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

(Repeat steps 2 & 3 for all five decades.)

4. Conclude with (three times): Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

The Chaplet of the Divine Mercy can be prayed anytime, but it is especially recommended during the Novena in preparation for the Feast of the Divine Mercy, which runs from Good Friday through the Feast of the Divine Mercy (April 18-25, 2025).

Jesus, I trust ín you!
