Dawn was approaching. It was a sad morning, filled with weeping. But then it changed. Radically, for He is alive! HE IS ALIVE! He has risen from the dead and He is alive!! Jesus, our Savior, our Lord, is ALIVE! Even his disciples still couldn't believe it. Peter and John left the empty tomb still wondering what had really happened. It wouldn't be until later, when Jesus appeared to them and took some food to eat, that they really believed He was alive. The disciples on the road to Emmaus also didn't believe it even as they walked and talked with him. It wasn't until later, as Jesus broke the bread with them, that they were filled with wonder and belief. They rushed back to Jerusalem to tell the rest.

Even today we have people who wonder if He is really alive. Yes, some of us believe. Others aren't sure that He is, and still others say, no way! But yes, He lives. Just as He promised. Life has overcome death. This changes everything. The Resurrection of our Lord changes everything. It is the key to understanding life. His life as well as our own life. It is the foundation of our faith. St. Paul preached that without this victory over death, our faith would be useless and vain. But it isn't. It gave Peter and the other disciples a new hope that brought them out of their hiding spots into the world, where they fearlessly proclaimed the new life in Jesus Christ. It changed the world. The same is true for us. Our future resurrection is secured upon the Resurrection of Jesus. We, who were dead because of sin, have received from God, full of mercy and the infinite compassion with which He loves, a rising from death to live with and in Jesus. Easter is the celebration of Jesus' Resurrection and our resurrection. It is the celebration of our thanksgiving and our joy.

Even though Jesus has returned to heaven to his Father, He has been seen by many people down through the ages. He appeared to Mary Magdalene and sent her to tell his disciples He was alive. He appeared to his mother. He appeared to his two disciples on the road to Emmaus. He appeared to Peter and the other ten disciples in the upper room and charged them with spreading the Good News of his life and teaching. They did this, for they saw the marks of the nails and lance. They saw him eat. They listened to his conversation. HE LIVES! He tells us that we have the opportunity to live with him forever.

He is risen. He has triumphed over death. He has overcome sorrow, anguish, and the powers of darkness. In him, we find everything. Outside of him, there is nothing.

May we never die because of our sins. May our resurrection be eternal. It will, if we live with and for him. Tell others. Tell everyone.

The Chaplet of the Divine Mercy is a beautiful prayer form that invokes God's mercy on ourselves and others. It is prayed using traditional rosary beads in the following manner:

- 1. Begin with the Sign of the Cross, 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary, and the Apostles' Creed.
- 2. On the Our Father beads, say the following: Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, of Your dearly be loved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.
- 3. On the 10 Hail Mary beads, say the following: For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

(Repeat steps 2 & 3 for all five decades.)

4. Conclude with (three times): Holy God, Holy Mighty One. Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

The Chaplet of the Divine Mercy can be prayed anytime, but it is especially recommended during the Novena in preparation for the Feast of the Divine Mercy, which runs from Good Friday through the Feast of the Divine Mercy (April 18-25, 2025).
