

Imagine this scene with me: you're standing on a hillside outside Jerusalem. The wind stirs lightly. The sun is beginning to set, casting a golden glow over the hills. You are with Jesus—the one you saw crucified, the one who rose from the dead. For forty days, He has been teaching you, walking beside you, sharing meals with you again. And now, you watch as He lifts His hands in blessing—and slowly, miraculously. He is taken up before your eyes into the clouds.

You stand there frozen, Silent, Stunned, What now? That's the question the disciples must have felt deep in their bones. What now?

And then, suddenly—angels appear and ask, "Why are you standing here looking up to the sky?" It's as if they're saying: "Don't just stand there. You've got work to do."

This moment is so important, not because Jesus is leaving, but because He's commissioning. He's handing the mission over-not to angels, not to scholars, not to politicians-but to fishermen, tax collectors, everyday people. People like vou and me.

Here's the practical truth of the Ascension: Jesus doesn't want us to keep staring at the heavens, waiting for Him to return. He wants us to bring heaven to earth-through our actions, our words, our witness.

The disciples could have gone home and said, "Well, Jesus is gone. I guess that's the end of the story." But they didn't. Scripture says they returned to Jerusalem with great joy. Why? Because they understood something essential: Jesus had not left them. He had been lifted up so He could be within them—through the Holy Spirit.

And this is where it meets our daily lives. When you're at home caring for a sick relative...When you're working hard at your job, trying to provide for your family...When you're the only one in your group who seems to be holding on to faith...When you feel small in a world full of noise and conflict...Jesus says: You will be my witnesses. Not when everything is easy. Not when you're perfect. Right now.

Just as the disciples had to go back and wait for the Holy Spirit, so must we. We need to pray, to listen, and to prepare. The power to witness doesn't come from ourselves—it comes from God. But we do have to show up. We have to say ves. That might mean taking time each morning for prayer. It might mean forgiving someone who hurt you. It might mean offering a kind word at work, or standing up for what's right when it's uncomfortable.

Jesus has ascended, yes—but He has not retired. He reigns in glory and acts through us. The world still needs His voice—and He has chosen yours.

So don't just stand there, staring at the clouds. Look around. Who needs to hear the Gospel from you? Who needs your love, your compassion, your courage? Let us open our hearts to the Holy Spirit and say, "Lord, I'm ready. Use me."

And may we live with the joy and boldness of people who know that Christ is not far away—He is with us always, even to the end of the age.

A Change to our Sunday Mass Schedule

The Sunday Mass schedule at SS. Peter and Paul, Ionia, and St. Edward, Lake Odessa, will be changing, **starting on Pentecost Sunday, June 8**th. The Saturday evening schedule will remain the same, but the Sunday Mass times will change. The new schedule is as follows:

SS. Peter and Paul – Saturday at 4:00 p.m., Sunday at 10:00 a.m., and Sunday at 12:00 Noon (in Spanish)

St. Edward – Saturday at 6:00 p.m. and Sunday at 8:00 a.m.

For many years we have had two Sunday morning Masses in English at SS. Peter and Paul. This has been true even though it has meant that our pastor was usually presiding at six Masses per weekend. Church law says that priests should celebrate no more than three, except in extreme situations. Our bishop has been patient in letting this go on for the past few years, but the time has come to make the change.
