# Prayer Chain

**Jesus Christ is ALIVE!** He has risen and lives forever. We know this. But it is something we really emphasize during this Easter season. He is Alive! And Jesus has given Himself to us. He has given us the Eucharist. This means the Eucharist is Alive. Maybe you already know this. Maybe you once knew it but forgot. Or maybe this is brand new. Jesus is the Eucharist. When we come up to Communion, we receive Him. We receive His Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity. We receive Jesus. We receive the Eucharist. Jesus is alive. The Eucharist is alive.

When a stranger watches us receive the Eucharist, would he know this? When we receive the Eucharist, does it look like we believe we are about to take into our bodies the living person Jesus Christ, true God and true Man? How many times, Lord, have I forgotten that the Eucharist is alive? As I wait in line to receive you, do I think of how much you want to unite yourself with me? Am I seeing your hands filled with the graces you want to give me? Am I filled with awe at how much you want to come to me in this most intimate way? Or am I distracted, thinking of other things?

The Host we receive is not a thing. It is not a wafer. It is not bread. It is a person---and He is Alive. Still wondering? Think of this. Back in 1916 when Our Lady was preparing to appear in Fatima, an angel, the Angel of Peace, appeared to Lucia, Jacinta, and Francisco. On his third visit, he brought with him the Eucharist. Suspending the Host and the chalice in the air, the angel threw himself prostrate on the ground and prayed:

Most Holy Trinity, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, I offer You the most precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, present in all the tabernacles of the world, in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges, and indifference with which He Himself is offended. And, through the infinite merits of his most Sacred Heart and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I beg of You the conversion of poor sinners.

An <u>angel</u> prostrates himself on the ground! <u>We</u> stand in line with our minds filled with distractions, walk up, receive the Eucharist, and return to our pews thinking about other things. But an angel, a pure spirit who lives in the presence of God, <u>prostrates</u> himself before the <u>Eucharist</u> in adoration! Think about it. It is a pretty strong message. It was so strong that young Francisco spent the rest of his short life trying to console God in the Eucharist.

So here is our invitation: We can treat God as just a symbol, or we can prostrate ourselves in front of Him, in adoration, gratitude, love and reparation. I am not suggesting we come up and throw ourselves on our faces in front of the Eucharist, but we can do it interiorly. As we receive, standing or kneeling, we can always, in our hearts, minds, and souls, be prostrate in loving God in the Eucharist. As the Sacred Congregation for the Sacraments and Divine Worship explains, "The Church has always required from the faithful respect and reverence for the Eucharist at the moment of receiving it" (Inaestimable Donum, 11). Pope Benedict XVI discusses it, saying that instead of arguing over receiving standing or kneeling, in the hand or on the tongue, we need to focus on the spirit of reverence with which the early Christians received the Eucharist.

In the Gospel of John, Jesus says: "I am the *living* bread . . . whoever eats this bread will live forever . . . just as the *living* Father sent Me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on Me will have life because of Me."
