

"Come, Holy Spirit!"

This Sunday, we celebrate Pentecost, the powerful moment when the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles and gave birth to the Church. What began in a locked room with frightened disciples became a bold public proclamation of the Gospel to people of every nation. This is not just a moment in history - it is a moment that continues to shape our lives today.

At Pentecost, we are reminded that God keeps his promises. Jesus had told His followers that He would send the Advocate, the Spirit of truth. And He did. That same Spirit now dwells within each baptized believer – in vou and in me.

St. Paul reminds us in today's second reading that the Holy Spirit gives us gifts "for some benefit" (1 Cor 12:7). These gifts are not just for personal growth – they are for the building up of the Body of Christ. Each one of us has something to offer: a gift of wisdom, service, leadership, kindness, or patience. And these gifts are meant to be shared.

In a world that often feels divided, noisy, and anxious, Pentecost reminds us that the Holy Spirit brings unity, peace, and courage. He helps us speak the truth with love, forgive others, and live as Christ's witnesses.

As we conclude the Easter season with this great feast, let us open our hearts to the Spirit anew. Pray each day: "Come, Holy Spirit." Let that prayer guide your thoughts, your choices, and your actions. Ask God to show you how to use your gifts to serve the Church and the world around you.

The Spirit is alive. The mission continues. And you are part of it.
