Dear Friends in Christ.

Pope Leo XIV issued his first apostolic exhortation, *Dilexi te* (On Love for the Poor), in early October. He writes in the exhortation, "We need to be ncreasingly committed to resolving the structural causes of poverty" (94).

One way in which you can help break down the structural causes of poverty is through the national collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) during the weekend of Nov. 15/16. Your support for this collection enables organizations to reach and empower people in ways best suited to the communities where they live and work. The CCHD has been successful at reaching people on the margins for more than 50 years because of its support for community-based solutions rather than top-down programs that do not account for local needs.

In addition to making a national impact, 25 percent of the collection renains in our diocese to support local anti-poverty initiatives. Projects that receive funding must adhere to the teachings of the Catholic Church and are approved by me. Your generosity during last year's collection allowed \$50,000 to stay in West Michigan to assist people living in poverty.

"Almsgiving at least offers us a chance to halt before the poor, to look nto their eyes, to touch them and to share something of ourselves with them. In any event, almsgiving, however modest, brings a touch of *pietas* into a society otherwise marked by the frenetic pursuit of personal gain (Dilexi te,

El Papa León XIV publicó su primera exhortación apostólica, Dilexi te (Sobre el Amor hacia los Pobres), a comienzos de octubre. En dicha exhortación escribe: "Debemos comprometernos cada vez más para resolver las causas estructurales de la pobreza" (n. 94).

Una forma en la que usted puede ayudar a acabar con las causas estructurales de la pobreza es participando en la colecta nacional para la Campaña Católica para el Desarrollo Humano (CCHD) durante el fin de semana del 15 16 de noviembre. Su apoyo a esta colecta permite a las organizaciones legar a las personas y empoderarlas de la manera más adecuada para las comunidades en las que viven y trabajan. La CCHD lleva más de 50 años llegando con éxito a las personas marginadas gracias a su compromiso con soluciones basadas en la comunidad, en lugar de programas impuestos desde arriba que no toman en cuenta las necesidades locales.

Además de tener un impacto a nivel nacional, el 25 por ciento de la colecta permanece en nuestra diócesis para apoyar iniciativas locales contra la pobreza. Los proyectos que reciben fondos deben adherirse a las enseñanzas de la Iglesia Ĉatólica y cuentan con mi aprobación. Gracias a su generosidad durante la colecta del año pasado, se destinaron \$50,000 para ayudar a las personas que viven en situación de pobreza en West Michigan.

"La limosna, invita al menos a detenerse y a mirar al pobre a la cara, a tocarle y compartir con él algo de lo suyo. De cualquier manera, la limosna, por pequeña que sea, infunde pietas en una vida social en la que todos se preocupan de su propio interés personal" (Dilexi te, 116).
