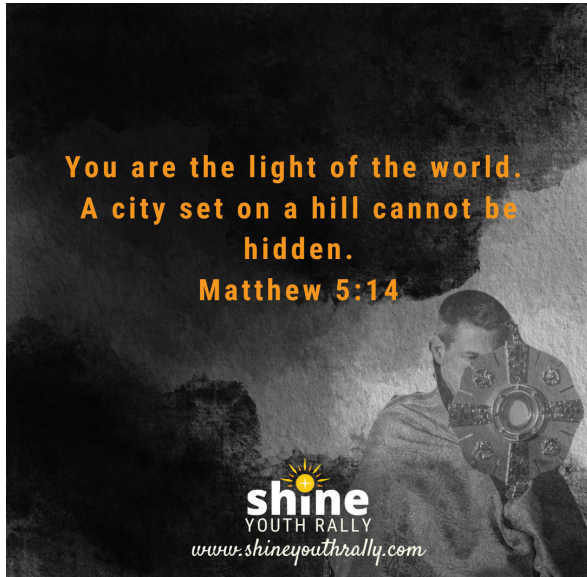
Knights Corner
